E.g. $8 - 3 = 5$

Key Knowledge:

Maths

'Pass it on' game
Apply your addition and subtraction skills to this game: Each player starts with 6 objects. Roll a 1-3 dice or pick a card that has 1-3 on it. Pass that number on to the player on your left. Keep going until someone has passed all their objects on.

Writers' workshop: Let's get writing! Have a go at writing a caption for a picture, a sentence, card, story or anything else you would like to try!

Maths

How many have been subtracted?
Ask your grown up to put up to 10 objects in front of you and then cover them up with a tea towel. Your grown up will then take some away from under the towel. When the towel is removed can you work out how many they subtracted?

PE: Manipulation and Coordination

Using your baton, with a grown up try dribbling a ball or a ball of socks around a space, then set up some obstacles for you to dribble around: Weaving in and out of 5 obstacles, dribbling in a figure of 8 around 2 obstacles, dribbling between pairs of 2 obstacles.
